Filled with light and optimism, *Symphony No. 7* is immediately recognizable if you've seen the film, *The King's Speech*. Changlu Wu, who plays the pipa (a Chinese lute) graces the stage with a work written to celebrate the folk music of the Qilian mountains in China. This performance kicks off with Canadian-American composer Jared Miller's *Ricochet - Reverb - Repeat*, which takes inspiration from electronic samples.

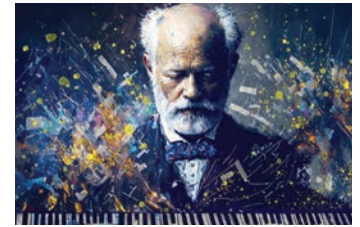

CELEBRATING BLACK COMPOSERS

The WSO celebrates Black composers, performing Samuel Coleridge-Taylor’s *Four Novelettes*. He was a British composer of mixed-race heritage, a descendant of an African-American soldier. A late 19th Century Romantic powerhouse, Coleridge-Taylor wrote in the style of Dvořák. Adolphus Hailstork’s work, *Sonata da Chiesa* (*Church Sonata*), represents his African, Native-American, and European roots.

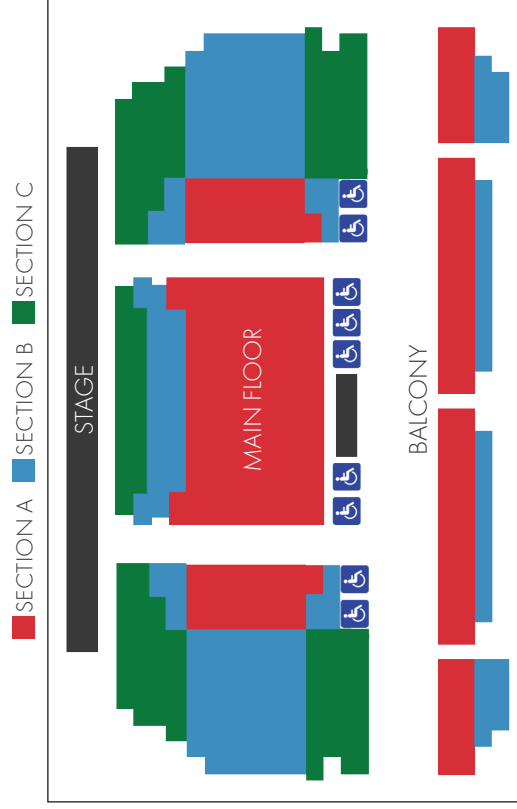
